






Nearly half of all 2,450 full-time city employees work in Public Safety



The City Charter

- Defines the city's powers and functions.
- Sets the governance structure including seven elected officials:
- Mayor and six Councilmembers and six city officers:
- City Attorney, City Auditor, City Clerk, City Judge, City Manager, City Treasurer/CFO
- Amending or modifying the charter requires a public vote.

ARTICLE II. CITY COUNCIL

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Sec. 2-16. Mayor.

The mayor shall sign all orders, together with warrants, drawn on the treasury. He shall execute all bonds, deeds, leases, conveyances, and all other instruments authorized by the council and requiring his signature. In addition to the requirements of this section, he shall perform such other duties as may be required of him by law. (Code 1972, § 2-301)

Sec. 2-17. Date and time of regular meetings.

The council holds regular meetings at 5:00 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday of each month. The mayor or four (4) members of the council may schedule additional regular meetings, or may cancel or reschedule any regularly scheduled meeting to any day or time of the same month, but not less than two (2) regular meetings shall be held each month. At the discretion of the mayor or four (4) members of the council, regular meetings that are scheduled to be conducted on consecutive days may be combined and held on either of the two (2) days, and shall be considered a single meeting.

Special meetings of the council may be scheduled by the city clerk at either the request of the mayor or four (4) members of the council.

A notice of regular meeting changes or scheduled special meetings shall be posted as required by law.



Anti-Discrimination Ordinance No. 4497

It is the policy of the city that all persons be treated with respect and dignity... Each person has the right to receive service from the city in a manner that promotes equality under the law and prohibits unlawful discrimination, including harassment and retaliation.

These policies apply to all elected and appointed officials, employees, and volunteers while acting within the scope of their city duties and all contractors, vendors and consultants of the city...









Who are Scottsdale's neighbors?



























Scottsdale's Budgets

Scottsdale's annual budget includes two main components, one is for capital projects that become long-time assets and the other is for city operations, which fund services for the public.



Capital Budget

Funds long-term investments in the city such as building, acquisition and improvement of infrastructure and facilities.

Operating Budget

Funds the day-to-day city operations and services.



All other uses of funds: \$619.2




Where Do My Property Taxes Go?


