Accessing the ‘Coordinated Entry System’

The ‘**Coordinated Entry System**’ is a connected system that identifies appropriate resources for each individual’s needs. Individuals and families will be administered an assessment called the ‘Vulnerability Index - Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool’ (VI-SPDAT) which helps prioritize access to available housing based on health and wellness factors. This may lead to housing interventions such as emergency shelter and rapid re-housing & permanent supportive housing programs.

Another part of the coordinated entry process is a ‘diversion’ conversation. This is an approach that identifies resources (both personal and systemic) that an individual or family may utilize to avoid shelters and voucher programs.
