Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) Jail Compliance Notification

In July 2013, per email exchange with MCSO representative Robert Hargrave, MCSO will **only provide non-compliance jail notices** to the Scottsdale City Court (court) i.e. they will only provide notice to the court of those defendants that do not successfully surrender and/or complete their court ordered jail time (a specific confinement order).

Historically, Scottsdale City Court has not consistently received confirmations of jail completions/successful surrenders from MCSO due to reported staffing resource shortages at the facility.

As such, this court order provides a consistent, operational process to overcome and resolve the impact of the reporting inconsistencies from MCSO regarding the completion/non-completion of court ordered jail time.

THERFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the court's standard, MCSO jail compliance date is defined and determined by taking the court ordered jail start date plus the number of days to serve as entered in the court's case management system (CMS). This calculated date is used as the completion and compliance date for determining compliance.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that thirty (30) days after the jail compliance date, to allow MCSO to report non-compliance, automation will check the CMS for all MCSO confinement orders that have an outstanding balance. The system will check for a MCSO non-compliance notice, an outstanding warrant, or active appeal and if no such items are in the CMS, automation will electronically enter a "compliance" record into the CMS that gives the confinement order a zero (0) balance and dockets a confinement order completed event.
