The Court in keeping with the Report and Recommendations of the Task Force on Fair Justice for All and having reviewed our own statistics on failures to appear from arraignment, is changing the timeframe in which a warrant will be issued from 14 to 7 days for failures to appear at criminal arraignments.

WHEREAS Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order 2016-16 ordered that the Task Force of Fair Justice for All is established including the filing of a report of recommendations, referred to as "Report and Recommendations of the Task Force on Fair Justice for All: Court-Ordered Fines, Penalties, Fees, and Pretrial Release Policies".

IT IS ORDERED in absence of a specific judicial order; upon a failure to appear by the defendant or his/her legal representative for a Criminal Arraignment; AFTER A PERIOD OF SEVEN CALENDAR DAYS FROM THE DATE OF FAILURE TO APPEAR a warrant will be issued per Judicial Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED in absence of a specific judicial order; upon a failure to appear by the defendant or his/her legal representative for a Civil Traffic Arraignment; AFTER A PERIOD OF FOURTEEN CALENDAR DAYS FROM THE DATE OF FAILURE TO APPEAR, the allegations of the complaint shall be deemed admitted, and a default judgment entered for the State, impose a civil sanction, and report such judgment to the Department of Transportation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED in absence of a specific judicial order; upon a failure to appear by the defendant or his/her legal representative for a Pretrial Conference, a warrant will be issued on the date of the failure to appear.
