Scottsdale Stadium gets facelift for 2025 spring training season

Spring Training is just around the corner and Scottsdale has just completed upgrades to Scottsdale Stadium to enhance the fan experience.

Renovation and reconstruction of the park's left-field berm adds patio space, more shade and more grass seating. The area will also feature multiple concessions, standing areas and additional restrooms.

The city also plans to open Scottsdale Stadium to the public on non-game days with a new, mixed-use day park scheduled to open in April 2025.

Scottsdale Regional Fire Training Facility opens



Scottsdale firefighters have a new place to train, thanks to a new, state-of-the-art facility which will prepare them for a wide range of emergencies and ensure they have the skills needed to respond with excellence in any situation.

The new facility features cutting-edge training structures, including a five-story burn tower, a three-story basic skills building, and a comprehensive outdoor skills area with props for hazardous materials, technical rescue, and aircraft rescue and firefighting scenarios.

It also features a 30,000-square-foot training building that includes a large classroom-style auditorium. This multifaceted facility not only supports the department's training needs but also contributes to firefighter wellness, helping to recruit, train, and retain a dedicated workforce for years to come.

This new facility, which was built largely with voterapproved bond financing, opens at a critical juncture for the Scottsdale Fire Department because more than onethird of the department's workforce is eligible to retire in the next five years. This new training facility will be the key to effectively and safely train the next generation of Scottsdale firefighters.
