Subject: 2025 National Community Survey Results

In late January through mid-March, 5,500 randomly selected households were asked to participate in Scottsdale's administration of the National Community Survey. This statistically valid survey provides insight into how city residents feel about the Scottsdale community, about their local government, and about their interactions with both.

The city can then use that data to prioritize initiatives, services and programs – this process is an important component of Scottsdale's commitment to providing top level services to the community. Because similar surveys are conducted in hundreds of jurisdictions, Scottsdale can compare its results with other cities across the country (the "benchmark comparison" data noted below).

Scottsdale residents report high satisfaction in community survey

People who live in Scottsdale enjoy a high quality of life and consider the community an excellent place to live. Noteworthy highlights are provided below.

Public safety remains a significant strength

Over 9 in10 participants reported feeling safe in their neighborhood and in Scottsdale's downtown / commercial area during the day. Additionally, high marks were given for our fire, ambulance and emergency medical services.

Residents report overwhelmingly positive ratings for the city's economy

With most aspects of economic life scoring higher, and sometimes much higher, than the national benchmark, residents feel that Scottsdale is a great place to work, visit and has a variety in businesses, services and shopping establishments. Additionally, an increased proportion felt that the economy would have a positive impact on their family over the next six months.

Residents praised parks and recreation opportunities, while mobility and transportation received mixed reviews

Most residents gave excellent or good ratings across multiple recreational and park-related services, rating many higher than national benchmarks. In terms of Scottsdale's natural environment, residents were pleased with the cleanliness of the community, overall quality and preservation of natural areas and yard waste pick-up. Most residents rated the quality of the overall transportation system as either good or fair, similar to ratings in benchmark communities. Street lighting, street cleaning and sidewalk maintenance were rated positively by 7 in 10 residents, while less than 5 in 10 rated traffic flow positively.

Feelings about land use fall

Some ratings related to community design saw a notable decrease, particularly in areas like overall quality of new development, overall appearance and preservation of the historical and cultural character of the community which all decreased by 8% or more. While nine in ten residents view Scottsdale as an excellent or good place to live, ratings for well-planned growth, overall design, public spaces for people to spend time, and land use, planning and zoning all decreased.

Of the 122 evaluative questions included on both the 2023 and current survey iterations, 23 ratings decreased since 2023. Those which decreased by more than 7% are deemed statistically significant and are noted below.

The survey and its methodology

Scottsdale has used the National Community Survey since 2003 as a statistically valid means of measuring community satisfaction and feedback on city programs and services, data that can then be used by the organization to set priorities and align services based upon community input. The National Community Survey is designed specifically for use by local governments and has been used by more than 500 communities nationwide.

A random sample of 5,500 households in Scottsdale received the survey by mail, and about 9% of those completed and returned the survey. The margin of error around any reported percentage is 5% for the entire sample of 330 completed surveys. In addition, 1,096 people took an online version available to everyone – those results are kept separate from the statistically valid sample results.

Next steps: seeking community feedback more frequently

While Scottsdale has long used a biennial survey to gather community feedback with statistical validity, we recognize that more frequent surveys would likely be even more useful to monitor progress on key initiatives and overall community satisfaction.

To provide that, we are contracting with a new provider who will employ new methodology. Randomly selected participants will be asked to participate in a survey to measure their levels of satisfaction with the city's infrastructure, overall quality of life and community characteristics on a quarterly basis beginning this October.

Responses will be gathered through strategic on-line components and social media outlets and results compiled to represent Scottsdale's demographics proportionately. Selecting a group of geo-located participants at random assures that the results are representative of the community within a known margin of error.

The city will use the feedback to prioritize initiatives, services and programs in the future. The data collected is an important component of Scottsdale's commitment to providing top-level services to the community.

Because similar surveys are conducted in hundreds of jurisdictions, Scottsdale will still have some benchmark comparisons to review along with this quarterly survey.

Scottsdale's resident survey – the National Community Survey – will open for a randomly selected sample of 5,500 Scottsdale households beginning this week.

Households are selected at random to ensure every resident in Scottsdale has an equal chance of being selected, and the results are statistically valid within a range of certainty known as the margin of error. Notifications occur by mail; residents complete the survey online (but can contact us for a paper copy if they prefer).

Once the random sample survey period closes, we will open an identical web survey to the entire community for two weeks so that anyone in Scottsdale who wants to provide feedback may do so. We will publicize this opportunity via the city's communication channels. Data from the open survey set will be kept separate from the random sample; data and reports are expected in April.

A copy of the survey instrument is attached for your information. We ask that this not be shared while the random sample survey is being administered. Additional information is provided below, please contact me if you have questions.

BACKGROUND

Since 2003, Scottsdale has contracted with the National Research Center (now Polco) to conduct a resident survey. Surveys were conducted in 2003, 2004, 2006, 2010, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2020 and 2023; results are available at ScottsdaleAZ.gov, search "survey."

The NCS is specifically for local governments and was among the first scientific surveys to gather resident opinion on a range of community issues, including safety, mobility, natural and built environments, economy, recreation and wellness, education and engagement.

Because similar surveys are conducted in hundreds of jurisdictions, Scottsdale can compare its results with other cities across the country. In addition, surveying helps measure progress since the baseline has been established from previous surveys.

The bulk of the questionnaire remains consistent between surveys so that data and trends can be tracked over time.

The NCS costs \$24,950, which covers creating the survey and survey documents, randomly selecting a sample of approximately 5,500 unique addresses, printing, mailing, data entry and analysis and creating both a report of results, a report comparing results to prior surveys, and a report of normative comparisons with other similar jurisdictions. The report also includes demographic and geographic subgroup comparisons to show if there are substantive differences between subgroups.
