How to identify an opioid overdose

- Heavy nodding, deep sleep, hard to wake up, or vomiting.
- Slow or shallow breathing (less than 1 breath every 5 seconds) snoring, gurgling or choking sounds.
- Clammy, sweaty skin.

signs of overdose.

WHAT TO DO IF SOMEONE OVERDOSES

STEP 1 → STIMULATE PERSON AND CALL 911 

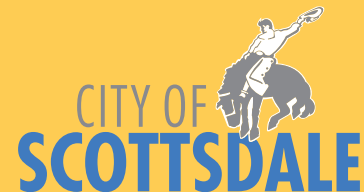
STEP 2 → ADMINISTER NALOXONE, IF AVAILABLE 

STEP 3 → IF PERSON RESPONDS, LAY THEM ON THEIR SIDE TO SUPPORT THEIR BREATHING 

STEP 4 → IF NO RESPONSE, RESCUE BREATHE FOR 2-3 MINS THEN GIVE SECOND DOSE OF NALOXONE 

STEP 5 → STAY WITH PERSON UNTIL EMERGENCY WORKERS ARRIVE

Dangers of Opioids

Prescription opioids and illegal opioids like heroin are addictive and can be deadly.

More than two people die every day from opioid overdoses in Arizona.

Opioid Overdoses

Opioids cause slower respiration. When someone takes too much of an opioid, they can overdose and stop breathing.

An opioid overdose is a medical emergency that can result in death if not addressed quickly.

Harm Reduction

FDA has approved several different medications to treat substance use disorders. These medications relieve the withdrawal symptoms and cravings that cause chemical imbalances in the body.
